Omaha Chalk Art Festival, sponsored by <a>Omaha Steaks
Saturday & Sunday, September 9 & 10, 2023 | Midtown Crossing

The 5th Annual Omaha Chalk Art Festival, sponsored by Omaha Steaks, is now accepting applications from artists or artist teams for its festival to be held on Farnam Street in Midtown Crossing. Chosen artists/artist teams agree to participate free of charge and, in return, will enjoy creative control of their chalk art masterpiece and receive significant visibility and exposure throughout the weekend festival. In addition, the artist/artist team chosen as *Best of Show* will be awarded a prize of \$1,000, and the artist/artist team voted at *People's Choice* will receive a \$100 gift card to the Midtown Crossing retailer of the winner's choice.

This year's festival theme is "What Unites Us". Artists/artist teams are invited to represent the theme in their piece, but are not required to do so.

The Omaha Chalk Art Festival is proud to partner with the <u>Food Bank for the Heartland</u>, bringing awareness to the organization's work to eliminate hunger in the heartland. Festival attendees will be encouraged to bring or make donations to the Food Bank. The People's Choice Award voting will include an additional donation component. Back by popular demand, the Omaha Chalk Art Festival, an eye-popping addition to the city's arts and culture landscape, returns to Midtown Crossing on September 9 & 10, 2023. A weekend-long celebration of local and regional artists, as well as two professional chalk artists, will transform the sidewalk along Farnam Street in Midtown Crossing into a gallery of pastel chalk masterpieces. Visitors are invited to observe and admire as they stroll Farnam Street, enjoy each artistic drawing, food, drinks and browsing. Now in its fifth year in Omaha, the Chalk Art Festival concept is tremendously popular around the world – from Curtatone, Italy, to Denver, Colorado.

The Tradition

The chalk art event follows street painting traditions that originated in 16th century Renaissance Italy when artists began transforming pavement into canvas using chalk. The artists were called "madonnari," after their customary practice of creating chalk paintings of the Madonna. Historically, madonnari were known for their lives of travel and freedom, making their living from coins received from passers-by. With World War II came many hardships, greatly reducing the number of these artists. The art form was not officially brought back to life until 1972 when the small town of Grazie di Curtatone in Italy started the first international street painting competition. Today, artists worldwide are taking to the streets, bringing with them new ideas, techniques, and excitement for this ancient form of expression.

Requirements:

- 1. Artists are required to submit a rough sketch and brief description of their proposed chalk drawing. The application will not be considered without it. Please submit one (1) image of the art you wish to create and three (3) images of your past artwork in any medium.
- 2. Artwork for the festival must be appropriate for public viewing. No words, symbols or logos intended as advertising may appear within the chalk drawing image. Additionally, the image should be appropriate for viewing by people of all ages, so no profanity, political commentary, nudity or adult content is allowed. Inclusion of any of these items will result in immediate removal of your art.
- 3. Artists who plan to reproduce another living artist's work MUST provide written permission in the form of an email or letter from that artist or his/her representative.

- 4. Artists are not allowed to sub-advertise their square/space in any way. Official sponsors and artists only.
- 5. Chalk will be provided; however, if artist is using a predominant color in their design they may want to purchase that color before the festival. Only non-oil-based soft chalk/pastels in a solid form may be used for the street painting. Acrylic paints, spray can pastels/chalk, spray field chalk, oil-based pastels, hard pastels, etc. are not acceptable.
- 6. All squares are 6' x 6'. If your artwork is not square, it must be 6' in one direction.
- 7. Chalk artists at the festival are not paid.
- 8. Midtown Crossing provides:
 - One set of 24 soft pastels
 - Access to an indoor station, stocked with water and light refreshments throughout the weekend.
 - Access to workshop hosted by professional chalk artist Michael Rieger
 - Significant visibility and exposure, including artist listing on Midtown Crossing website and social media, festival map and more.
 - \$1,000 awarded to the "Best of Show" artist or artist team
 - \$100 gift card awarded to the People's Choice artist or artist team
- 9. Artists are asked to work on their chalk drawings both Saturday and Sunday to accentuate the live art experience.
- 10. Artists must be at least 19 years of age.
- 11. Enter as soon as possible. Deadline to enter: July 31, 2023
